Inclusion Ireland and the National Federation of Voluntary Bodies will jointly host three seminars to disseminate the learning from the above project.

The Moving Ahead project was a research study that examined the factors that contribute to the successful transfer of residents with intellectual disabilities from congregated to community-based living arrangements in two regional areas in Ireland.

The studies were undertaken by a team of researchers from Ireland and the UK, led by the School of Social Work and Social Policy, Trinity College Dublin. The research was awarded funding from the Health Research Board's 'Health Research Awards 2012-2014'.
